At Halton Women's Place our mission is to provide shelter and crisis services for abused women and their dependent children and is dedicated to ending violence against women and their children. Halton Women's Place continues to be the only organization in the Region of Halton to provide such residential services. Last year more than 700 women and 400 children accessed our services as residential and/or community clients. Our staff responded to approximately 2,000 crisis calls.

Programs and Services at Halton Women's Place

Transitional Housing and Support Program

This program helps women who have experienced domestic violence rebuild their lives by assisting them to establish a network of support and to find and maintain housing. We also work with women who are living with their abuser. We help them make choices to increase their safety and the safety of their children.

Bridging Families Program

The program is collaborative program between Halton Women's Place and Halton Children's Aid Society to coordinate outreach services for families experiencing domestic violence.

The program provides appropriate gender responsive and sensitive services, which bridges families to community resources and helps families foster healthy relationships, thereby ensuring children's safety. Case workers provide support, counselling, advocacy and information to help women establish violence free lives and to build on family strengths. The services are sensitive to the social, economic, 'ableness,' cultural and racial diversity of the family constellation.

Public Education and Outreach Program

In 2006-2007, Halton Women's Place has designed an outreach program to link to various diverse communities in the Region. The program trains advocates from various communities to outreach with an anti-violence framework. The advocates are culturally competent leaders of their community. This program enables them to foster healthy relationships within their community while providing support, education and community resource knowledge to women and children experiencing violence and trauma.

Homework Club

Thanks to Royal Bank, Halton Women's Place has organized a Homework Club that has volunteers assisting the kids with their homework twice a week at each shelter location. This Homework Club has created a lot of enthusiasm with the children as they look forward to their club dates! This is just another way that Halton Women's Place, with the help of local business and volunteers, is working with the children staying at the shelter to be proud of living a violent-free and loving life.



Halton Women's Place – Donor Bill of Rights

PHILANTHROPY is based on voluntary action for the common good. It is a tradition of giving and sharing that is primary to the quality of life. To assure that philanthropy merits the respect and trust of the general public, and that donors and prospective donors can have full confidence in the not-for-profit organizations and causes they are asked to support, we declare that all donors have these rights:

1. To be informed of the organization's mission, of the way the organization intends to use donated resources, and of its capacity to use donations effectively for their intended purposes.
2. To be informed of the identity of those serving on the organizations governing board, and to expect the board to exercise prudent judgement in its stewardship responsibilities.
3. To have access to the organization's most recent financial annual audited statements.
4. To be assured their gifts will be used for the purposes for which they were given.
5. To receive appropriate acknowledgement and recognition.
6. To be assured that information about their donation is handled with respect and with confidentiality to the extent provided by the law.
7. To expect that all relationships with individuals representing organizations of interest to the donor will be professional in nature.
8. To be informed whether those seeking donations are volunteers, employees of the organization or hired solicitors.
9. To be assured that Halton Women's Place will not rent, sell, trade or share its donor mailing lists.
10. To feel free to ask questions when making a donation and to receive prompt, truthful and forthright answers.
